Week 1

HANNAH AND SAMUEL (1 Samuel 1-3)

Week 3



Hannah prayed for a child and promised to dedicate him to the Lord. God gave her Samuel, and she kept her promise. God called Samuel and raised him up as a prophet for Israel.

Brite Idea: God cares about us.

DAVID AND JONATHAN (1 Samuel 20)

Week 4



Saul was king, but God chose David to replace him. As David lived with Saul, Jonathan became his closest friend. When Saul grew jealous and tried to kill David, Jonathan helped him escape, choosing God's plan over becoming king.

Brite Idea: God's plan comes first.

WEEK 3 God cares about us. What does this mean for me?	READ TOGETHER: Matthew 11:28-30 How would you describe the rest Jesus offers in these verses?	Someone closes their eyes. Others take turns saying "Samuel!" in a funny, disguised voice. The person with eyes closed guesses who spoke.	LUKE 1:37 If God cares for us and can do the impossible, what should we worry about?	Ask your pastor one way your family can serve your church family this week.	Make friendship bracelets and pass them out to friends. READ TOGETHER: 1 Samuel 20:35-42 DISCUSS: What does this teach us about God?
WEEK 4 God's plan comes first. What does this mean for me?	READ TOGETHER: Ephesians 2:8-10 What does it mean to walk in good works God prepared for us to do?	Play rubber-band archery with rubber bands and any target. After each shot, take one step back to increase challenge.	LUKE 1:37 If God calls us to do something that seems too hard, how should we respond?	Have each family member use six words to describe a great friend. Challenge each other to be those six words for your friends this week.	Dunk a candle in water, then try lighting it. Discuss best way to start fire. READ TOGETHER: 1 Kings 18:30-39 DISCUSS: What does this teach us about God?
